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Ingatestone and Fryerning Parish Council Minimum Reserves Policy

This policy was adopted at a Full Council meeting on 4 April 2019

- 1. The purpose of this policy is to set out how the Council will determine and review the level of reserves.
- 2. Ingatestone and Fryerning Parish Council is required to maintain adequate financial reserves to meet the short-term liabilities of the organisation.
- 3. Reserves can be used for long term planned or exceptional (unbudgeted or high than expected) expenditure on the understanding that the expenditure must not be recurring.
- 4. Budget allocations may be moved from one budget line to another during the year, with approval from the Full Council or Committee (depending on the size of the amount in question, following Financial Regulations guidance)
- 5. Ingatestone and Fryerning Parish Council has recognised the following short-term liabilities that must be covered by their reserves:
 - a. A three-year grounds maintenance contract running from 2019-2022 at a total cost of \$84000
 - b. One-half of the Parish Council's other annual expenditure at a cost of £61000
 - c. A three-year Seymour Field maintenance contract for grass cutting, pitch maintenance, line marking and litter picking at an estimated cost of £51,000
 - d. Seymour Pavilion and Field ring-fenced reserve of £50,000
 - e. Office rent commitment to October 2021 of £13,500
 - f. Non-ring-fenced emergency reserves at a cost of £17,500
- Therefore, for the financial year 2019-20, Ingatestone and Fryerning Parish Council's reserves will total £277,000 and will be reviewed in April 2020 for the financial year 2020-21
